(1) Total no. of sample feedback collected from the students is 160 out of which 92 are from Arts stream and 68 from Science stream students respectively. Feedback from Arts stream comprises 57.5 percent and Science stream 42.5 percent.

(2) Total number of teacher in the college is 40 comprising 23 (57.5 %) in Arts stream and 17 (42.5%) in Science stream respectively.

(3) Out of the total 40 teachers of both the stream 35 are awarded as **'Very good'** and rest 5 as **'Good'**.

(4) The percentage of **'Very Good'** teacher is 87.5 of the total teachers. 57.14 percent of teachers of Arts stream and 42.85 percent of teachers of science stream are rated as **'Very Good'** of the total very good teachers.

(5) The percent of good teacher is 60 in Arts and 40 in Science Stream. No teacher in the rank of **'Satisfactory'** and **'Below threshold'** is found in both the stream.
